in North America, with wolves being one of the major scavengers and predators in Algonquin.

There are **EIGHT** yurts available in the Park.

By paddle and portage, more than

**2,000 KILOMETRES**

of canoe routes and over 1,900 campsites are available in the backcountry of Algonquin Park.

Algonquin Park has over **1,000** vascular plants and more than **200** vertebrates that breed within its boundaries.

Algonquin Park lacks municipal numbering such as civic address numbers, so they use **KILOMETRE MARKINGS** to identify locations in numerous areas.
